• The Selectmen reviewed recommendations from Nancy Whitman regarding preservation of the old town hall. She is working with Andrew Cushing from the NH Preservation Alliance to have the town hall included on the state historic preservation rolls which make the building eligible for LCHIP grants. There was discussion on a time line for obtaining quotes for repairs and the selectmen will discuss the project further with Mrs. Whitman.

• The Selectmen discussed with Jeff Cantara, Road Agent, and Chief Sullivan an email from resident requesting additional stop signs at the King Road/Burns Hill Road intersection. Mr. Cantara expressed concerns about vehicles getting stuck if they had to stop at the intersection when there was snow on the road. In regards to concerns about speeding in the area, Chief Sullivan said that he will do more patrols in the area to curb speeding. The Selectmen will be having the intersection surveyed to see if there is enough of a right-of-way in the intersection to make address problems with visibility.

- o George Clayman, Chief Alexandria Fire Department
 - Chief Clayman explained that the Fire Department will be purchasing a new overhead door that will replace the two that are currently at the Fire Department. The overhead door will be purchased this year, but not installed until next year.
- Jeff Cantara, Road Agent
 - Mr. Cantara provided an update on road repairs that were necessary as a result of the October 30, 2017 rain and wind storm. A representative from FEMA was in town today looking at looking at the areas with the most damage. Work will continue on repairs through next week.
- Chief Donald Sullivan, Police Department
 - Chief Sullivan praised the response to the storm by our Emergency Management Director, Fire Department, and Highway Department in opening the Emergency Operations Center and Emergency Shelter and coordinating repairs to the roads.
