TOWN OF ALEXANDRIA NEW HAMPSHIRE

AN ORDINANCE SETTING FORTH CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS ON THE USE OF THE TOWN ROAD KNOWN AS "BOG ROAD"

Bog Road travels in a northerly direction from the state highway known as New Hampshire Route 104 some 3.25 miles to its intersection with Washburn Road, Town Pound Road and North Road. Some portions of this road, generally at or near the northerly and southerly ends are settled with residences, while the majority of the roadway winds through undeveloped woodlands of mixed hard and soft woods. Near the midpoint of this road is Foster Pond, so called. The area north and south of this pond is a prime wetland containing an immense aquifer of great value. This road was constructed many years ago, and in many locations over unstable, mucky terrain. It is frequently subject to high water. It is, for all practical purposes, not possible to maintain this road to modern standards. This ordinance is intended to protect and preserve the entire length of this roadway. Nothing herein shall prohibit delivery vehicles serving the residences on this road, or other roads leading from Bog Road for which there is no other avenue of approach. This exception includes those construction vehicles servicing properties which require increases to the weight limits established below; however in no event shall any vehicle pass over the Patten Brook Bridge exceeding the posted weight limit for that bridge.

- No vehicle with weight exceeding 26,000 pounds, gross vehicle weight, shall be allowed. This limitation shall not apply to official emergency vehicles.
- No vehicle which transports hazardous materials shall be allowed. The term "hazardous" shall be as defined by the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 49, Transportation, Parts 100-199 (a copy of which is available at the selectmen's office).
- The maximum speed limit for this road shall be 30 miles per hour.
