

Alexandria Selectmen's Meeting Minutes

January 8, 2019

- ❖ **Members Present:** George Tuthill, Chet Caron and Robert Piehler
 - The meeting came to order at 6:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
 - The minutes from the December 18, 2018 meeting were approved.
- ❖ **Items Reviewed and Signed**

- ❖ **Business**
 - The Selectmen reviewed a proposal for signs for deliberative session and voting; purchase of the signs was approved.
 - Mr. Tuthill read a notice from the Alexandria Conservation Commission that they will be holding a series of photography classes at the Alexandria Village School on January 23, January 30, February 6, and February 20 from 6 to 7 pm.
 - James Robison, NHEC, was present to review NHEC's application for a pole license for poles along Kummerer Road. Mr. Robison stated that the current poles headed to the Linfield property through the woods are damaged and unsafe to climb for repair. NHEC would like to remove those poles and place poles along the side of Kummerer Road. Mr. Linfield plans on building on property he owns along Kummerer Road and had requested NHEC extend poles along the road. Mr. Robison acknowledged that Mr. Lacasse, 245 Kummerer Road, has concerns about clearing along the edge of the road for placement of the new poles. Mr. Tuthill asked if Mr. Lacasse would incur any additional expenses from communications providers to switch to the new poles; Mr. Robison said he was not sure what or if other utilities would charge. Mr. Robison said that he believed Mr. Lacasse had reached out to the other utility companies but received no definitive answer.
 - The Selectmen discussed the need for an ordinance that addresses snow being plowed across town roads. Mr. Cantara expressed safety concerns with people plowing across the road as well as concerns regarding the potential for damage to equipment with the snow that people plow into roadway freezes or hardens. There was discussion regarding having an initial warning and then a fine for subsequent offenses.
