

Alexandria Selectmen's Meeting Agenda

March 3, 2020

- ❖ **Members Present:** George Tuthill, Chet Caron and Robert Piehler
- ❖ The meeting came to order at 6:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
- ❖ The minutes for February 25, 2020 were approved.
- ❖ **Items Reviewed & Signed**
 - Permit to Trap: David Perry for land owned by the Town of Alexandria on Bog Road
 - The Selectmen discussed an email from Conservation Commission expressing opposition to trapping at Barrett Park. There was some discussion regarding boundaries for Barrett Park and whether or not they had been established. The Selectmen approved the permit to trap as long as Mr. Perry does not put traps within the area of Barrett Park.
 - Application for Temporary Relief from Road and Bridge Weight Limit Restrictions: Ben Hall for Poor Farm Road logging operation
 - Mr. Tuthill stated that the Selectmen consulted with the Road Agent prior to the meeting and he had no problems with the Selectmen authorizing the waiver.
- ❖ **Items held for further review:**
 - Multiple blanket purchase orders for highway supplies/materials/repairs
- ❖ **Business**
 - Reminder: Town Voting Day Tuesday, March 10, 2020, polls open 11 am to 7 pm at old Town Hall. The Selectmen have provided a voting guide that is available on our website as well as in the Selectmen's Office.
 - The Selectmen addressed a complaint received from Bob Gray concerns regarding Sye Ali Road drainage; the Selectmen has already proposed a solution and asked residents on Sye Ali Road to be patient.
 - The Selectmen addressed a complaint from a resident with concerns on treatment she received at transfer station, that the Town no longer recycles paper, and the closing of the free shed; the Selectmen will discuss the concerns with Tony Brown, Transfer Station Supervisor.
 - The Selectmen addressed a complaint from Donald Allen regarding concerns on the condition of Berry Farms Road. Mr. Caron stated that he visited the area and the road is very passable. Mr. Caron also expressed that the Highway Department addresses road repairs in the order of severity of the road condition.
 - The Selectmen reviewed a letter from Governor Sununu regarding HB1402 involving clean energy legislation; the Selectmen felt that needed more information before offering support.
 - Mr. Tuthill said that the Town Hall Preservation committee has been actively meeting but will not pursue an LCHIP grant this year. There was discussion regarding the need to move the propane tanks at the old town hall and the possibility of burying the tanks behind to building. Mr. Piehler asked Nancy Whitman if the preservation committee would like him to request additional funds from the historical society for repairs; Mrs. Whitman said not at this time.
 - Mrs. Whitman announced that the Town Hall preservation committee is looking at holding a "cabin fever reliever" dance on April 4th at the Town Hall as a way to raise funds and raise awareness of the preservation efforts.
