WELLINGTON STATE PARK PASSES: Wellington State Park beach passes are available to be purchased through the Town Clerk/Tax Collector's Office. Wellington State Park is owned and run by the State of New Hampshire. Each year, the Town applies for a special use permit from the State in order to provide the passes. The special permit only grants the town the ability to sell passes to residents and/or taxpayers of the Town of Alexandria, their spouses and dependent children. The beach passes are nontransferable. Please keep in mind that the state recommends making reservations to the park; otherwise access to the park is on a first come/first serve basis. Please plan ahead in the event the parking areas reach capacity. For more information or to make a reservation visit nhstateparks.org.

REMINDER: Payments for tax bills can be made online via electronic check or credit card by visiting our website at alexandrianh.com and clicking on the "Property Taxes Review/Pay Online" button.

Service Fee: We are using Invoice Cloud to process your actual payment. To cover the cost of the transaction, Invoice Cloud charges a service fee, the amount of which depends on the method by which you choose to pay and the costs to Invoice Cloud associated with processing that type of transaction. Electronic checks (ACH) are charged a flat fee of \$0.95 per transaction. Credit and debit cards are charged 2.95% of the amount being paid. For instance, if you are paying \$100 by credit card, the service fee will be \$2.95. Making a Partial Payment? Partial payments can be made by adjusting the Payment Amount on the Check Out Page.

What is 911 C.A.R.E.S.? New Hampshire 911 C.A.R.E.S. (Citizens' Assistance Registry for Emergency Services) is a program of the Division of Emergency Services and Communications that allows account holders to associate a phone number with an individual who has a chronic medical condition or additional information that is vital for first respoinders. When NH 911 is from phone number registered with C.A.R.E.S., 911 telecommunicator answering the call has immediate access to the information that has been submitted to the C.A.R.E.S. database.

A C.A.R.E.S. entry can provide additional contextual information for a telecommunicator as they handle a call. Examples of conditions that are eligible for C.A.R.E.S. entries include conditions that may affect the caller's state of mind, may affect the initial actions of first responders arriving on scene, or may affect the caller's ability to communicate. Eligible conditions include Alzheimer's, dementia, cognitive disability, epilepsy, diabetes, hearing impairment, the presence of a pacemaker or LVAD, medication allergies, and more. A C.A.R.E.S. entry may also include information to help first responders access a patient, such as gate codes for security gates or a note regarding the presence of a service animal. All 911 C.A.R.E.S. data is stored in secure database that can only be accessed by authorized personnel. Additionally, this information will only appear on a 911 telecommunicator's screen when a call is placed from a telephone number that is associated with a C.A.R.E.S. individual.

How do I access 911 C.A.R.E.S.? The NH 911 C.A.R.E.S. database is a self-service program that can be accessed onine by going to cares.desc.nh.gov. If you do not have access to a coimputer/internet, paper forms can be requested through the NH 911 C.A.R.E.S. office at 603-271-6911 or email: NH911CARES@desc.nh.gov.

Haynes Library
