REMINDER: Payments for tax bills can be made online via electronic check or credit card by visiting our website at alexandrianh.com and clicking on the "Property Taxes Review/Pay Online" button.

Service Fee: We are using Invoice Cloud to process your actual payment. To cover the cost of the transaction, Invoice Cloud charges a service fee, the amount of which depends on the method by which you choose to pay and the costs to Invoice Cloud associated with processing that type of transaction. Electronic checks (ACH) are charged a flat fee of \$0.95 per transaction. Credit and debit cards are charged 2.95% of the amount being paid. For instance, if you are paying \$100 by credit card, the service fee will be \$2.95. **Making a Partial Payment?** Partial payments can be made by adjusting the Payment Amount on the Check Out Page.

SPECIAL SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING: The Newfound Area School District will be holding a Special School District Meeting for the purpose of raising and appropriating money for the purchase of real property in Bristol (former TD Bank building) for housing its SAU office.

WARRANT ARTICLE I: Shall the Newfound Area School District vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$665,400.00) for the purchase of the TD Bank Building at 10-20 North Main Street, Bristol, New Hampshire; Six Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$665,400.00) to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the Municipal Finance Act RSA 33:1 et seq. as amended; to authorize the School Board to apply for, obtain, accept and expend federal, state or other aid, if any, which may be available for said purpose and to comply with all laws applicable to said project; to authorize the School Board to issue, negotiate, sell and deliver said bonds and notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon and the maturity and other terms thereof; and to authorize the School Board to take any other action or to pass any other vote relative thereto? (3/5 ballot vote required)

- Official Ballot Voting: November 25, 2025 at town polling locations. In Alexandria, this will be at Town Hall, 45 Washburn Road.

Parking Ordinance

Pursuant to NH RSAs 31:39, 41:11, 41:11a, 47:17 VII and VIII, 265:17 and other applicable statute under NH Law, the Select Board adopted an ordinance related to parking in the Town of Alexandria. Within description of authority, the ordinance for parking will be established to protect the general health, safety, and welfare for residents of the Town of Alexandria and the general public. The ordinance utilizes a system for administrative enforcement of parking violations and collection of penalties. The Parking Ordinance is available in the Select Board Office and on the town's website under "Maps, Forms & Documents".

The parking ordinance establishes that any vehicle parked in the following locations shall be deemed to be in violation and a fine would be levied:

- Upon any area of Town of Alexandria property posted to prohibit parking.
- At any place where official signs specifically prohibits parking.
- Any overnight parking on any Town of Alexandria property without prior approval from an authorized agent.

CodeRED® is the FREE community notification system available to Alexandria residents that will send you alerts concerning time-sensitive and/or emergency information that may impact your area via phone calls, text messages, emails, and social media. AVFD encourages you to actively participate in emergency preparedness by remaining informed.

Uses: The CodeRed® system will be used to send critical communications, from evacuation notices to missing child alerts.

Caller ID: When you see the following displayed, you will know the call is from us. If you would like to hear the last message delivered to your phone, simply dial the number back.

- General notifications: 1-855-969-4636 or General Comm

Privacy: Your contact information remains private and will only be used for community notifications.

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Transfer Station

REMINDER: **Transfer Station Stickers are REQUIRED** for the disposal of any waste at the facility. Permits can be obtained at the Transfer Station from an attendant and should be placed prominently on the left side of the vehicle which is disposing of the solid waste. You will be required to obtain a new permit each year.

Lithium-Ion Battery Disposal Ban Info - As of **July 1st**, it is illegal for anyone in New Hampshire - resident, business, hauler, or transfer station (just to name a few) - to throw lithium-ion batteries into the waste stream to end up in a landfill or waste-to-energy incinerator. In accordance with RSA 149-M:27: "No person shall dispose of any wet-cell batteries, lithium-ion batteries, or electronic devices in any solid waste landfill facility or incinerator in New Hampshire." If it's rechargeable, it's recyclable! Where To Recycle Lithium-Ion Batteries: Many New Hampshire municipalities and businesses like Staples, Best Buy, Home Depot, and BatteriesPlus, have collection boxes for recycling rechargeable batteries. To find the nearest drop-off site check Call2Recycle.org or visit one of the retail locations mentioned above.

Haynes Library – Ham Radio Class

A class for people interested in getting their Ham radio Technician license will be held at the Haynes Library on October 11 and 18, at 1:00 both days.
