

Alexandria Selectmen's Meeting Minutes

September 30, 2025

- ❖ **Members Present:** George Tuthill, Chet Caron and Robert Piehler
- ❖ The meeting came to order at 6:00 pm and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
- ❖ The minutes from September 16, 2025 were approved.
- ❖ **Items Reviewed and Signed**
 - Notice, Agreement and Release of Liability for construction on Class VI/Private Road: Lakeview Heights Map 417 Lot 27
- ❖ **New Business**
 - The Select Board announced that Grafton County is hosting a series of public informational meetings regarding the Proposed Grafton County Courthouse Project; the nearest meeting is Wednesday, October 1, 2025 at 7:00 pm at the Historic Bristol Town Hall on Summer Street in Bristol.
 - The Select Board shared that they received a letter from NH Police Standards thanking Chief Suckling for his assistance with the Police Academy.
 - The Select Board announced that there have been election law changes; links to information about the changes will be added to the Town's website.
 - There was discussion regarding the special meetings the Newfound Area School District will be holding regarding the purchase of the former TD Bank building in Bristol to house the SAU offices for \$665,400. A budget hearing was held on 9/25/25, a bond hearing will be held on 10/9/2025 at 6:30 pm at Newfound Regional High School Auditorium, a deliberative meeting will be held on 10/25/2025 at 10:00 am at Newfound Regional High School Auditorium, and an official ballot voting day will be held on Tuesday, 11/25/2025. For Alexandria residents, voting will take place on 11/25/2025 at Town Hall, 45 Washburn Road, with polls open from 11 am to 7 pm.
- ❖ **Old Business**
 - Tiny Homes on Town Pound Road
 - The homeowners were given until 9/30 to be compliant. If they remain noncompliant past 9/30, they will be sent a cease and desist letter.
 - Orange Road unpermitted driveway
 - The property owner given until 9/30 to install culvert and submit a driveway permit. If they remain noncompliant past 9/30, they will be sent a cease and desist letter.
 - 367 Welton Falls Road
 - Michael Provost, Health Officer, stated that he visited the property again, did another inventory, and said the vehicles are not being removed in a timely manner. On 9/26/2025, Mr. Provost filed a motion for a hearing with the court and is waiting for approval from a judge.
 - There was discussion on how the black water from the campers and outhouse is being handled; Mr. Provost said that a service comes to pump out the tanks.
