

Alexandria Selectmen's Meeting Minutes

April 21, 2026

- ❖ **Members Present:** George Tuthill and Brian Lewis
- ❖ The meeting came to order at 6:00 pm and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
- ❖ Approval of Minutes from April 7, 2026
- ❖ **Items Reviewed and Signed**
 - Gravel Tax Warrant: Boake Morrison Map 418 Lot 224
- ❖ **New Business**
 - The Select Board voted to accept any additional donations received for the Conservation Commission from their birdhouse workshop.
 - Someone dropped off a solar pane at the transfer station and there was discussion on what to charge; Mr. Sirard stated that the charge is \$1.00 per pound.
 - Mr. Lewis relayed questions the planning board expressed regarding impact fees. Someone approached the planning board about a mobile home park and impact fees were discussed. Someone also approached the planning board about putting four seasonal yurts on a piece of property on Bog Road; there was discussion about potential wetlands impacts and state permitting requirements.
 - Richard Nialetz requested permission to prune the tree that is between the library and town hall; the Select Board authorized the pruning of the tree.
 - Rosemary Homer inquired if the town had any plans for celebrating the U.S. 250th year of independence. The Select Board stated that there are no plans established at this moment, but welcome ideas on how to commemorate it or volunteers that would like to coordinate a celebration. Mrs. Homer stated that she has submitted a letter to the U.S. government to obtain a commemorative letter to pay tribute to the 250th year.
- ❖ **Old Business**
 - Street Lights
 - Eversource has referred the Town to Affinity LED to perform an audit of our street lights and price upgrading the fixtures to LED as well as pricing out street lights near the new transfer station. Pricing will be obtained for upgrading the 4 street lights that are not working, including the one that Eversource removed at the intersection of Fowler River Road and North Road, plus pricing for two lights at the new transfer station location.
 - New Transfer Station
 - The permit to operating is pending approval from NH Department of Environmental Services
 - Boake Morrison has requested that the Town transfer the operating permit for old transfer station into his name.
 - There was discussion about safety concerns with the intersection of Route 104 and Cass Mill Road due to anticipated increased turning at the location due to the location of the new transfer station. Suggestions included approaching the state about a blinking yellow light, signage stated that traffic may be turning, and additional turn lanes.
 - AMC/Shem Valley Road Parking: The Select Board has a call scheduled for 4/24/26 with NH State Senator Daniel Innis, NH State Representatives Lex Berezny and Donald McFarlane to review concerns.
 - Reminder: Town equipment is being sold via sealed bid (due May 5th): 1957 FWD Fire Truck, 2016 Ford Explorer (old cruiser), 2007 Ford F550 flatbed with front plow, and 2009 Sterling LT9500 with dump body.
