

# Alexandria Selectmen's Meeting Agenda

## May 19, 2026

- ❖ **Members Present:** George Tuthill, Robert Piehler and Brian Lewis
- ❖ The meeting came to order at 6:00 pm and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
- ❖ Approval of Minutes from May 5, 2026
- ❖ **Items Reviewed and Signed**
  - Building notification: Map 411 Lot 30
    - This is for a small sawmill shed on 702 Washburn.
  - Building notification: Map 411 Lot 93-1
    - This is a two-bedroom cape, a small loft on Bristol Hill Road.
  - Building notification: Map 418 Lot 205
    - Addition of 500 square feet to home.
  - PA-29 Application for Property Tax Credit/Exemption: Map 418-65-1 Elderly Exemption
  - 2026 1<sup>st</sup> issue property tax warrant
  - 2026 MS-535 Financial Report of the Budget
  - Purchase Order: Northeast MDTs LLC for laptops, printers and installation for cruisers with part of the cost being covered by grant funds.
- ❖ **New Business**
  - Review cemetery request to purchase new enclosed trailer for equipment using cemetery trust funds to protect equipment and keep it secure. The Select Board is in favor of obtaining the trailer. Nancy Whitman mentioned that her son is selling and enclosed trailer but she was unsure of the size; Mrs. Whitman will contact the Cemetery Trustees to discuss.
- ❖ **Old Business**
  - Welton Falls Road bridge
    - The temporary beams are in. It will be a few more months before we actually close the road down, because they're working on building the new bridge off site.
  - 367 Welton Falls Road
    - Michael Provost, Health Officer, went to the property with Chief Suckling after obtaining an administrative warrant from the court. This was after repeated failed attempts to contact the property owner to inspect the property again. Mr. Provost had been concerned about contaminants regarding disposal of waste from the campers; no contaminants were found. Mr. Provost will update the property inventory and provide the inventory and pictures from the property to the Select Board office. There was discussion about the unregistered vehicles on the property and the number of campers on the property. The next step will be instituting daily fines and pursuing additional action through the court.
    - Mr. Provost stated that he went to a court hearing regarding a neighbor that has filed civil charges against the property owner of 367 Welton Falls Road; the property owner did not attend the hearing.
  - 250<sup>th</sup> Celebration July 4<sup>th</sup>
    - Nancy Whitman said it was suggested that there's so many other things going on Fourth of July that we have something in fall instead. The Saturday of Labor Day weekend we are going to join forces with the Fire Department for their annual pig roast, and we're going to have something that day. Mr. Piehler said that Joe Kraemer is donating his time to build cornhole boards and suggested that the cornhole boards be auctioned off at the event to raise funds and purchase plastic all-weather cornhole boards that can be left outside. There was discussion about other items that might be able to be auctioned off as well.
